Anastasia Angelopoulou is a graduate of the School of Theology at the Faculty of Theology in the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. She holds a Master's Degree from the same School, about the relationships between Jews and Greeks, according to Josephus. She, also, holds a Ph.D. from the School of Social Theology and the Study of Religion at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens under the title: «Religious propagandas at the metropolitanates and bishoprics of the vilaiet of Thessaloniki, 1870-1912. The Issue of the disputed holy places of worship at the local Greek orthodox communities».

She worked on various administrative positions, as well as research projects and committees at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. Since 2019 she is working as specialized technical laboratory staff at the School of Social Theology and Christian Culture in the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and since 2021 as laboratory teaching staff at the same school.

Her research interests include issues about the ecclesiastical community and national history in the 19th century. The focus is in Macedonia and its relationship with the religious propagandas in the ottoman domain until the Balkan wars.

Her writing work includes monograph edition, book-teaching manual, scientific articles at the laboratory of History, Policy, Diplomacy and Geography of the Church at the School of Social Theology and Christian Culture, also in Honorary Volumes.
