Evangelos Pepes was awarded his Bachelor from the Department of Pastoral and Social Theology of the Faculty of Theology, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. He holds a Master's Degree from the same Department. As a fellow of the Greek State Scholarships Foundation, he also received a Master's Degree in Theology from the University of Edinburgh. He obtained his PhD from the Department of Pastoral and Social Theology of the AUTH. He is certified as an adult teacher of non-formal education by the National Organisation for the Certification of Qualifications and Vocational Guidance. He taught Secondary Religious Education for twelve years, the last five of them in an Experimental High School. He taught at the Pedagogical Training Programme of the School of Pedagogical and Technological Education. In addition, he has taught at a Public Vocational Training Institute for the diploma: "Religious Tourism and Pilgrimage Tours". He performed academic research for the Centre for the study of Christianity in the non-Western World at the School of Divinity of Edinburgh University. He was also a research fellow and afterwards as Laboratory Teaching Staff of the Laboratory of Pedagogy-Christian Pedagogy at the Department of Pastoral and Social Theology of AUTH, participating in the construction, management and implementation of research projects, training seminars, scientific conferences, workshops and lectures. He has training experience, having designed, implemented and taught in training and lifelong learning programmes at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, the University of the Aegean, the University of Crete, the University of Ioannina as well as some other training institutions. In 2019 he was elected an Assistant Professor in the theory and practice of Christian Pedagogy, and at the same time, became the Director of the Laboratory of Pedagogy and Christian Pedagogy at the Department of Social Theology and Christian Culture of AUTH. His research interests include the areas of school Religious Education and Religious Education Didactics. His literary work includes scientific studies, chapters in scholarly books, the editing of volumes of conference proceedings, articles and presentations at conferences and workshops.
